The Congress theme is Nature⁺, a simple and memorable slogan that captures the fundamental importance of nature and its inherent link to every aspect of our lives. Nature⁺ is like the beginning of a mathematical equation. But it is an unfinished one; something must come after to make it complete.

Nature is the vital component of every aspect of our lives, from the economies we have developed to the food we put in our children's mouths. Everything we do, everything we try to achieve is intrinsically attached to Nature.

This is a bond we cannot break.

Nature is naturally strong. Even the most delicate looking plant, animal or ecosystem is relatively tough, their survival instincts honed over generations of evolution. But many years of human civilization have undermined our environment and the fundamental natural infrastructure that supports our lives, communities and economies.

Nature⁺ is about boosting the resilience of nature – improving how quickly nature and people adapt to change. Better use of the inherent robustness of nature leads to healthier natural systems, better results from ecosystem and biodiversity restoration, and healthier people, communities and economies.

The Congress will explore many of our most pressing environmental and development challenges from this perspective and how strong and resilient nature is intricately linked to solving these issues.

About the World Conservation Congress

As the world's largest and most important conservation event, the IUCN World Conservation Congress is a unique event with a unique audience. It is the only global summit that represents every aspect of conservation, bringing together leaders of all levels – from governments and international NGOs to academia and local associations.

Held every four years, the IUCN Congress aims to improve how we manage our natural environment for human, social and economic development. Leaders from government, the public sector, non-governmental organizations, business, UN agencies and social organizations discuss, debate and decide solutions for the world's most pressing environment and development issues.

Effective conservation action cannot be achieved by conservationists alone. The 2012 IUCN World Conservation Congress is the place to put aside differences and work together to provide the means and mechanisms for good environmental governance, engaging all parts of society to share both responsibilities and the benefits of conservation.

The Congress has Two Main Parts:

- The Forum is a hub of public debates bringing together people from all walks of life to discuss the world's most pressing conservation issues. There are many different types of events you can get involved in to explore the depths of conservation and innovation.
- The Members' Assembly is IUCN's highest decision-making body. A unique global environmental parliament, it involves governments and NGOs large and small, national and international making joint decisions.

For 2012, the IUCN World Conservation Congress has adopted a new format, aiming for greater coherence and cross-fertilization between the two parts. Main messages of each day of the Forum are presented to the Assembly the following morning. Forum sessions related to motions presented at the Assembly are also identified.

- Influence Through the collective strength of more than 1,200 government and non-governmental Member organizations, IUCN influences international environmental conventions, policies and laws.





IUCN World Conservation Congress Jeju 2012

K-POP Nature⁺ Concert

The concert will take place to celebrate the opening of the 2012 IUCN World Conservation Congress and share the meaning of congress slogan Nature⁺ by linking the global environmental issues and Korean pops.

This concert organized by KBS, a South Korean radio and television network, is to be held in the special outdoor stage at ICC Jeju on 8 September 2012 at 19:00 - 21:30. It consists of 2 parts: Part 1 (performances by goodwill ambassadors of IUCN and the 2012 IUCN Congress) and Part 2 (performances of top Korean pop stars, including BoA and 2AM, and eco-friendly fashion show by the famous Korean fashion designer Lie Sang Bong). And it will be broadcasted through KBS World to 72 countries to maximize the significance of hosting the concert.



Pavilions

People are the driving force for a future with nature and through collective efforts we can bring about the changes needed to protect the environment our lives so depend on. The pavilions at the World Conservation Congress offer a window into the vast range of work that happens at IUCN. Implementing field projects and gathering data on the ground, the vast network of scientists and experts contributing to the IUCN cause constitutes an invaluable source of information that helps shape conservation work internationally and locally.

Visit the pavilions during your stay at the Congress and find out about some of the most compelling stories on conservation work today. You will able to learn about the most innovative partnerships that will drive conservation globally in the coming few years, talk to the right people and see how you too can get inspired to help nature.

Conveniently located on both the main lobby and fifth floor of the International Convention Centre (ICC), the pavilions also provide an ideal venue to close a negotiation started at an event or simply mingle with other peers. Moreover, they will be the backdrop to regional side events, so keep an eye out for what's happening there!

Species Pavilion

We all too often forget man is just another species of mammals. One of the most compelling arguments by nature is the variety of animals large and small that it homes. How sad the world would be if we couldn't be moved by their distinctiveness and beauty! Better knowledge about species, the threats they face and the conservation measures that can be taken helps drive action. This pavilion will showcase how, by combining world-class knowledge, standards and tools with a mobilized network of IUCN Members and partners, we can foster real change in policies and action on the ground to conserve species.

Business & Economy Pavilion

No matter how hard we try to minimize our footprint on nature, we are all consumers and inevitably participate to the world's pollution. Nature conservation needs to engage all actors of society for it to be truly effective. Arguably, none has more impact on the environment than the business community, as it affects everything from production standards to consumption patterns. This pavilion showcases how business practices, market trends, consumer preferences and policy frameworks can be transformed to generate benefits for biodiversity and livelihoods depending on natural resources.

Blue Planet Pavilion

There's a whole world going on beneath the surface of the ocean. It is so different from ours, so vast and mesmerizing, it never fails to fascinate whoever ventures into its depths. Oceans and seas cover 70% of the planet and host huge and unknown biodiversity. This pavilion will demonstrate how, by sharing knowledge, exchanging information and views and launching and promoting marine conservation and sustainable development activities, we can ensure and foster the conservation of marine biodiversity, as well as the equitable and sustainable use of our oceans.

Protected Planet Pavilion

Man's step on the environment can be overwhelming if unchecked, too often leading to irreversible losses in nature's wildlife. The conservation of biodiversity increasingly relies on the foundation of protected areas. Such defined territories, including World Heritage Sites, make a significant contribution to addressing some of the world's greatest challenges, while also promoting thriving communities and enhancing the resilience of the planet. This pavilion will describe how effective management and governance of protected areas are vital to a just and equitably shared planet for the benefit of all.

A Just World Pavilion

People depend on the resources produced by nature. Yet nature's products are subject to social, geographic, economic and political considerations. The quality of decision-making processes around natural resources management affects the success of biodiversity conservation and the extent to which ecosystems can maintain and enhance their capacity to contribute to human well-being. This pavilion is about sharing power, responsibility and benefits in natural resource management, as well as strengthening governance arrangements, including legal entitlements, to make decisions more transparent, inclusive and equitable, may enhance opportunities for resilient communities and ecosystems.

Korea Pavilion

The Korea pavilion(Greening Korea) displays the successful practices for green growth in Korea and exhibits various activities to conserve ecosystems including the DMZ under the theme of "Green Growth and the DMZ in Korea". This pavilion will offer opportunities to share the best practices in environmental conservation and major outcomes and to encourage free discussions by conducting diverse event programs during the Forum on the fifth floor of the Congress venue.

Jeju Pavilion

Jeju was formed from the volcanic activities, and it is a hub for ecosystems which is known for its various and unique volcanic formations. Jeju was designated as a Biosphere Reserve in 2002, a World Natural Heritage in 2007 and a Global Geoparks Network in 2010, receiving all the three UNESCO designations in natural sciences. Also it was designated as one of New Seven Wonders of Nature in 2011. Jeju, the island of life for 7 billion global citizens has its own birth myth, history, and the unique characteristics of local culture. The island is now building its image as a sustainable eco-city, eco-tourism, and a world environmental hub. This pavilion can be found on the fifth floor of the ICC Jeju.









Conservation Campus

Knowledge is a key component of the IUCN Congress and the Conservation Campus gives you the chance to take advantage of cutting-edge expertise. The commitment and scope of specialists providings trainings there form a skills pool of such breadth and diversity that it promises to create one of the richest learning experiences.

Positions are limited to 50 participants maximum per session. Preregistration is therefore required and can be done through your online registration account. There may be some places available for on-site registration. Additional information will be available at the Registration centre or the information desks.

The Conservation Campus is taking place at the Lotte Hotel in Jungmoon Resort, five minutes' drive or 30 minutes' walk from the Congress venue (ICC Jeju). Shuttle buses are organised each morning, lunchtime and evening between ICC Jeju and the Lotte Hotel. Ask at the Congress information desk for more information.


How To Get to Conservation Campus (ICC Jeju - Lotte Hotel Jeju)



Nature-based solutions to climate change

Nature⁺ climate: Can Nature save us?

Human-induced climate change continues unabated, and some of its impacts are irreversible. Reducing greenhouse gas emissions is the only long-term answer to stabilising the global climate. But as a new wide-ranging global climate deal remains elusive, many are turning to nature-based solutions, like REDD+ (reducing emissions from deforestation and ecosystem degradation), to help stave off the worst effects of climate change. Nature has often been portrayed as the victim of climate change but healthy natural ecosystems such as forests, peatlands and wetlands are critical for absorbing and storing carbon and helping us adapt.

- But are these measures enough?
- Can ecosystems really make a difference before it is too late?
- What have we learnt already about nature-based solutions to climate change and what are the challenges for the future?

Nature-based solutions to food security

Nature⁺ food: Can we feed the world sustainably?

Food production systems rely on the richness and diversity of natural ecosystems. One billion people worldwide rely on fish as their primary protein source, while bush meat provides 80% of the protein and fat intake for rural communities in Central Africa. Pollination services are worth an estimated USD 153 billion annually. Agriculture everywhere relies on adequate and well-managed water resources. Fisheries production also relies on healthy marine and freshwater ecosystems – and at the moment is far from sustainable. To secure food supplies, equitable and sustainable use of natural resources is required. Food security is also linked to human security on a broader level.

- Are we serious about redirecting 'perverse' subsidies that currently wipe out biodiversity on land and in the sea?
- What impacts are biofuels likely to have on food production and food security?
- What is the role of technology in feeding the world?
- Can sound environmental management help prevent or reduce conflicts and improve human security?

People everywhere depend directly or indirectly on nature for their wellbeing. From food, fuel and freshwater, to crop pollination, flood protection and climate regulation, nature provides the fundamental infrastructure needed for our societies to survive and prosper. All too often, nature is absent from development aid.

Members' Assembly

The Members' Assembly, the main governing body of IUCN, brings together IUCN's Member organizations and institutions to debate and establishes environmental policy. More than 100 resolutions and recommendations are expected to be adopted by this unique global environmental parliament of governments and NGOs. Members also vote on IUCN's Programme of work and Financial Plan for the following four years, elect the IUCN President and Council, and manage the business affairs of the Union.

Agenda

Responding to one of the key outcomes of the external evaluation of the 2008 World Conservation Congress, the infused structure of the Forum and Members' Assembly agendas represents a major innovation of the 2012 World Conservation Congress, forging a stronger connection between the two main elements of the Congress. Whereas previous Congresses saw the Members' Assembly begin once the Forum had ended, this time the Assembly will begin earlier through the running of five daily two-hour sessions in the mornings before the Forum opens. By aligning the agendas of these morning sessions with the Forum theme on the basis of the Draft IUCN Programme 2013-2016, the Members' Assembly will ensure in-depth discussion of the Programme, while links between discussions held in Forum events and those related to proposed motions in the Members' Assembly will be strengthened.

Congress Documents

Documents are available for nearly all items on the agenda of the Members' Assembly. A first batch of documents mainly covering the agenda items for which Congress decisions are required has been posted on the Congress website in all three official IUCN languages on 5 April 2012. A second batch with the remaining documents has been posted there on 8 July 2012. Updated versions or new documents may be posted there as they become available.

For the first time, Congress documents have only been made available via electronic means in order to help reduce the footprint of the 2012 Congress.

During Congress, new documents or revised versions of motions and other documents will continue to be made available primarily via the Congress website. A limited amount of copies will be printed only for delegations which request to receive hard copies.

The Congress Committees

- Steering Committee: This Committee, required by the IUCN Statutes, oversees the overall organization of the Congress and is comprised of the Council appointed Congress Preparatory Committee, as well as the President, Vice-Presidents and Director General.
- Credentials Committee: This Committee examines and supervises the accreditation process of Member delegations and certifies to the Congress the delegates in good standing (dues paid up to and including 2011) who are able to exercise their voting rights. The committee is composed of members nominated by the President and approved by Congress.
- Resolutions Committee: The Resolutions Committee aims to ensure the fair consideration of motions to be adopted as Resolutions and Recommendations. The committee is elected by Congress and includes members of the Resolutions Working Group established by Council to prepare motions for consideration by Congress.
- **Programme Committee:** This Committee supports the process for approving the 2013-2016 Programme and specifically the impact of motions that affect the Programme or a Commission mandate.
- Finance and Audit Committee: The Finance and Audit Committee will be elected at the opening of the Congress to review the finances of the Union in the period 2008-12, the proposed intersessional financial plan 2013-16, and to advise on any financial matter referred to it by the plenary sessions including to comment on the financial implications of actions called for in motions.
- Governance Committee: The Governance Committee will be elected at the opening of the Congress. It will make recommendations related to proposals by Council to amend the IUCN Statutes or any other governance related issues and motions.

Regional Members' Meetings

All regions will have Members' meetings during the first two days of Congress. The regional meetings will be followed by an informal gathering for Members and candidates in the Members Lounge in order to allow interactions with the candidates before voting begins.

For the first time, elections will be held through an electronic voting system. Instead of distributing, collecting, and counting paper ballots, delegates to the Jeju Congress will use their microphone units and voting cards to elect their preferred candidates.





- Although the voting will take place over several days, the results will be communicated jointly on the Congress website after all the election rounds have been completed at the end of the day of 12 September.
- A comprehensive guide on the electronic elections system is available on the Congress website.
- Also, an introductory presentation on the electronic elections system will be given during the first Members' Assembly sitting on 8 September.
- Further, information on the candidates will be made available in the three official IUCN languages on posters displayed in the Congress venue and on the Election Candidates section of the Congress website. The election candidate pages on the website enable online interaction between candidates and IUCN Members.



Nature-based solutions to food security

The linkage between biodiversity, water and food security is important to recognize, as humans consume more than 7,000 different species of plants and animals. In the drive to address food security, there is a lack of understanding among policy makers that for many people, especially the more than 70% in less developed rural areas, wild sources of food form an integral part of people's diets. Loss of biodiversity and degradation of ecosystems undermines health, livelihoods, food production, and the availability of clean water—what grows in the wild is just as important as what grows on farms.

The Business and Ecosystems Think Tank (Workshops 337 & 338) on 8 September from 11.00 am to 1.00 pm and 2.00 pm to 4.30 pm, Yeongju Hall A

Co-convened by IUCN and the World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD), the Think Tank will challenge business and conservation communities to discuss and debate real solutions for changing pace on biodiversity and ecosystem services. Julia Marton-Lefevre, IUCN Director General, and Peter Bakker, WBCSD President will open the debate at 11.00 am, and will be followed by business leaders, who will illustrate effective business action on biodiversity and ecosystems (morning session) and government and financial institution representatives who will elaborate on what are effective policies (afternoon session). Airport

Jeju International Airport is situated 4km from downtown Jeju-si. Detailed information about shuttle buses can be found on arrival at the airport, in the hotels and at the Congress venue (ICC Jeju). Badges

Every participant will receive a badge when announcing him or herself at the registration centre upon arrival. Each badge is attributed to one person only and is non-transferable. Participants are kindly asked to wear their badge during all Congress activities and social events. Entry in the Congress venue (ICC Jeju) will not be permitted without a badge. Replacement of lost badges incurs a KRW 60,000 (CHF 50) administrative charge.

Banks and Foreign Exchange Offices

Public banks are normally open from 09:00 am to 16:00 on weekdays. They are closed on Saturdays and Sundays. There will be a bank in the registration centre, open from 09:00 to 16:00 from 4-15 September. The temporary bank will be closed on weekends. US dollars are the easiest to exchange but any major currency is accepted. Major currencies and traveler's checks can be exchanged into Korean won at the airport, hotels, and at all Korean banks. Credit cards, e.g. VISA, MasterCard, American Express, and Diners Club, are all widely accepted.

Bookstore [ICC Jeju 5F-8]

Located on the 5th floor of the Congress Venue (ICC Jeju) in the Members' Lounge area, the IUCN Bookstore is a convenient and congenial area for browsing and discussing IUCN publications. Open to all participants at the Congress, the Bookstore is the dedicated space for consulting and ordering publications and receiving assistance on finding and accessing IUCN Publications. The IUCN Bookstore is open from 8:00 to 21:00 from 7-12 September; from 8:00 to 21:00 on 14 September; and from 8:30 to 16:30 on 15 September. The Bookstore will be closed on 13 September during the excursion day.

Free, fuel-efficient congress shuttle buses are available for participants to commute between hotels and the Congress venue (ICC Jeju), as well as between Jeju International Airport and hotels/ICC Jeju.

Public transport in Jeju mostly consists of buses. There is no railway on the island. Buses cover most of the island, with services running around the coast or across the island every 20 minutes approximately. Make sure to have KRW 1,000 notes if you use public buses. From/to the airport there are public shuttle buses (airport limousines) than run every 15 minutes to most of the hotels and the Congress venue (ICC Jeju). It takes around 45 minutes to reach ICC Jeju. Please refer to the transportation guidebook for more details.

The average temperature in September in Jeju is 23°C (74°F). Clothing should be suitable for a changeable climate.





A raincoat or umbrella for occasional showers may be useful. The Northern Pacific brings cooling ocean breezes and moisture to the atmosphere.

Currency

The currency in Korea is the WON (\(\forall \)). Monetary units are KRW 10, KRW 50, KRW 100, and KRW 500 coins, and KRW 1,000, KRW 5,000, KRW 10,000 and KRW 50,000 notes. For higher denominations, negotiable cashier's checks are used. As an indication and subject to exchange rate fluctuations, KRW 10,000 equals approximately USD 8.50, CHF 8.20 and EUR 7. New bills were introduced in 2006. As a safety precaution, pay attention to the notes handed back to you when making a transaction.









Cycling

The bicycle provides an original and different way to discover your surroundings and of course the CO2 emissions are zero! A free bicycle rental will be available for Congress participants from the ICC Jeju. The Jeju Special Self-Governing province will pay 1 CHF in the Congress Carbon offset fund for each 10 kilometres cycled. Tax-Free Shopping

Value-Added Tax (VAT) is levied on most goods and services at the standard 10% rate and usually included in the retail price. You can receive a refund on your VAT if you purchase your goods at a shop with a TAX-FREE SHOPPING sign. Ask for a Global Refund Cheque payment slip at the time of purchase. You can get your refund, within 3 months of purchase, at the Cash Refund Office located at Gate 28 of Seoul Incheon Airport.

Taxis

Taxis are available 24 hours. They can be easily distinguished from regular cars by their signs on top of the car roof. You





can get a taxi at a taxi stand, or hail one on the street by waving at one. One taxi can carry up to four customers at once. Basic fare can be KRW2,200 according to the region. Various surcharges are applied according to the time of day. There is a night charge between midnight and four o'clock in the morning, or when crossing regional boundaries, which may amount to 20 % of the metered fare. Taxi fare from Jeju International Airport to Congress venue (ICC Jeju) is a fixed rate (approximately 30 USD). Taxis can even be rented for about 80 USD for 8 hours, driver included. International driving license is necessary. When taking a taxi, it is useful to have the address of the place you want to go (hotel, restaurant, etc) written in Korean, so the driver can correctly set up the GPS.

Telephone

The country code is 82 and Jeju code is 064. Drop the zero in front of the city/region code when dialing from abroad. Calls can be made using public phone cards, credit card calls and IC cards. Local, long-distance, international and cell-phone can be made. There are four kinds of telephone cards such as KRW 2,000, KRW 3,000, KRW 5,000 and KRW 10,000. Phone cards can be purchased at the IT Service Desk on the 5th Floor of ICC Jeju.

Time Zone

South Korea is 8 hours ahead of GMT (Greenwich Mean Time). The country does not observe daylight saving time.

Tipping

Service charges are automatically added to hotel and restaurant bills, as well as shops and taxis in Korea, so no further tipping is required. Tipping for an outstanding service is a matter of choice, but is not expected.

Tours desk

Tours Desk is available in the Registration centre at the Congress Venue (ICC Jeju). You can also visit tourist information centres at Jeju International Airport, Jeju-si, Hallasan and in some museums around the island. For tourism information on Jeju and Korea, visit www.visitkorea.or.kr.

Transport

Free, fuel-efficient congress shuttle buses are available for participants to commute between hotels and the Congress venue (ICC Jeju), as well as between Jeju International Airport and hotels/ICC Jeju.

Public transport in Jeju mostly consists of buses. There is no railway on the island. Buses cover most of the island, with



services running around the coast or across the island every 20 minutes approximately. Make sure to have KRW1,000 notes if you use public buses. From/to the airport there are public shuttle buses (airport limousines) than run every 15 minutes to most of the hotels and the Congress venue (ICC Jeju). It takes around 45 minutes to reach ICC Jeju. Timetables for both shuttles and public buses will be available at the various information desks located at at Registration Centre and Information Desk in ICC Jeju, at Jeju International Airport and at the hotels. You can also consult the transportation guidebook. A free bicycle rental service is also available for the more athletic participants!



Venues
